Know and understand The General Safety Obligation under Qld law (listed below) 2. All participants must be a current member of ANSA Qld (includes temporary memberships) 3. Be aware of your personal safety and the safety of others around you when handling fishing equipment and your catch 4. Carry at least two forms of communication with you 5. Carry and maintain a first aid kit, sufficient drinking water and sunscreen 6. Advise a third party of your plans and expected time of return 7. Brief any passengers on location of PFD's, operation of vessel and communication devices 8. Wear your PFD's and attach the motor safety lanyard. This is very important when fishing by yourself. 9. Use Coast Guard services and consider becoming a member. If you are intending to cross a coastal bar check with local Coast Guard or Voluntary Marine Rescue for the latest information 10. Maintain your vessel to the highest standards and carry all recommended safety equipment 11. Use a knotless net and a wet towel to handle fish. Review the club website for more information on fishing rules and fish handling practices www.sunshinecoastsportfishingclub.com.au 12. Perform pre trip inspections 13. Check the clubs Facebook group for any updates or messages 14. Members must be aware of their personal hygiene and food allergies. Do not participate in the preparation or consumption of food if you are unhealthy, or unsure. Discuss any concerns with the Activity Coordinator prior to participating.
Communication methods:	Check the Facebook message group for updates on activities. Members use Channel 72 Vhf marine radio for club chatter.
SIPS permit	Required if fishing within the impoundments as listed by Qld Dept of Fisheries
Other special Conditions:	No minimum or maximum size limits apply to this comp Minimize the impact on your captures that you are releasing. More information can be found in the Fishing Rules available from the club's website.

If you are aware of a non-member intending to participate in this event you must advise the Captain or any other Management Committee Member immediately as they will be required to take out ANSA Qld temporary membership

If it's not safe don't go out! No fish or prize is worth an accident or injury

General safety obligation

The *Transport Operations (Marine Safety) Act 1994* imposes a general safety obligation on all vessel owners and operators, masters and crew to operate vessels safely at all times. This responsibility includes making sure the ship is:

- safe
- properly equipped and maintained
- operated in a safe manner.

The general safety obligation prohibits a vessel from going to sea if it is not properly built and maintained, equipped, crewed and operated in line with its proposed operating environment.

Be a responsible skipper, before you head out on the water follow these simple tips:

- Check that your boat is in good condition.
- Check that you have all the required safety equipment on board. Ensure all safety equipment is in good condition and easily accessible, in case of an emergency. Make sure everybody on board knows where the safety equipment is stored.
- Report your trip. Let someone know where you are going, how many people are on board and when you intend to return.
- Have the right marine licence. Make sure you and your crew know how to handle the boat for where you are going.
- Know how to use your marine radio, which channels to use and when.
- Check the weather before you go out.
- Make sure you have enough water and fuel for the whole trip.
- Go easy on the drink—waves, wind and weather multiply the effects of alcohol. Far too many boating fatalities involve alcohol.
- Know the rules of the sea-road, and follow them.
- Lifejacket—wear it! If it's not on, it can't save you.
